## Reports

### Update on Return to Learn Plan

Today was the first day of school for the 2020-21 school year. Assistant Superintendent of Instruction Mike Ramm facilitated a report updating the Board of Education on the key areas of the district's Return to Learn Plan.

<u>Instruction.</u> Students enrolled in face-to-face instruction are learning remotely for the first three weeks and will report to their classrooms in person starting Monday, September 14. It is Dr. Shibler's intent that

in-person instruction will continue as long as Michigan remains in Phase 4 or above. Mr. Ramm reviewed professional development provided to staff to prepare them for a remote teaching environment. He also reviewed the remote learning schedules for students. Overall, the first day went well and the district will continue to support families to meet the needs of the students.

Executive Director of Community Services Lisa Jacobs will serve as the district's Elementary Rockford Virtual Director, and Jennifer Thompson will serve as the Secondary Rockford Virtual Director. Ms. Jacobs reported that the number of students enrolled in Rockford Virtual has increased significantly over the past couple of weeks from three percent to just over ten percent of total student population. RV students will receive instruction through a partner curriculum with support from a Rockford teacher (teacher/student ratios described later). Orientation, including livestreams on Tuesday, August 25, will be held this week with students beginning classes on Monday, August 31. Parents are asked to commit to at least one trimester of virtual instruction, which will allow the district time to redistribute staff if necessary between trimesters.

<u>Human Resources.</u> Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources Korie Wilson-Crawford reviewed staffing assignments to support students enrolled in Rockford Virtual. One full-time teacher will support developmental kindergarten students; two full-time teachers per grade level will support grades K-4; one full-time and one part-time teacher per grade level are provided for 5<sup>th</sup> grade; one full-time per grade level in grades 6-12; and content-specific certified teachers for secondary English, Math, Social Studies, and Science, for a total of 19.5 FTE teachers as of today. These numbers will fluctuate based on student caseload. Ms. Wilson-Crawford reported that 28 new certified staff have been hired for the 2020-21 school year, with most replacing staff who have retired. Despite perception, the number of retirees this year was low to average, with some being later than normal due to COVID.

<u>Special Services</u>. Executive Director of Special Services Mindy Duba reported approximately six percent of special needs students have enrolled in Rockford Virtual. In addition to their IEP, all special needs virtual students will be supported through a contingency learning plan individually created for each student. The CLP will outline the provision of additional special education services such as school social work, speech and language, and other ancillary services. These students will continue to be serviced by RPS teachers and itinerant staff in collaboration with the RPS virtual staff.

<u>Operations.</u> Assistant Superintendent of Finance Mike Cuneo reported on district preparations for busing, food service, technology, and maintenance. Seating on buses is limited and assigned, and students may have one pick-up/drop-off location for contact tracing purposes. Students will eat meals in their classrooms to minimize large group gatherings. Buildings will be regularly sanitized, and all classrooms equipped with PPE (personal protective equipment) and a sanitation toolkit which will be replenished regularly. Technical support is available to all families via <u>studenthelp@rockfordschools.org</u>, which can be found on the district's Return to Learn and Rockford Virtual webpages. Families may contact their child's school if they have questions or central office if they are unable to receive assistance from their school.

Dr. Shibler summarized by stating that administration has been continually working on plans to deliver education since the Governor closed schools last March. Due to the changing landscape over the past months, the unknowns of the future, and conflicting opinions on the appropriate response to the pandemic, he vows to make decisions based on information he believes to be in the best interest of students and staff. The Administration will provide monthly reports to the Board of Education as the school year progresses.
