I. OLD BUSINESS

J. NEW BUSINESS

1. Ratification of Board of Education Action after April 30, 2020

The Michigan Supreme Court recently ruled that the Governor did not have the authority to issue COVID-19 Executive Orders beyond those permitted in the Emergency Powers of the Governor Act (EPGA) or the Emergency Management Act of 1975 (EMA) after April 30, 2020. This has created debate about the legal landscape for school operations during the ongoing pandemic, including decisions made by the Board of Education during remote meetings relative to the Open Meetings Act (OMA) after April 30, 2020. Therefore, out of an abundance of caution and upon recommendation of district legal counsel, Dr. Shibler will recommend the Board of Education adopt a motion to ratify all action taken at board meetings held remotely after April 30, 2020, in which a quorum of the Board was not convened in a physical location.
