College Applications

- Pay attention to deadlines
 - Use Nov. 1st as a guide
- Transcripts
 - Send through Parchment
- Test Scores
 - Usually on transcript, some colleges require them directly from College Board
 - Pay attention to test optional policies at your school and talk to your counselor BEFORE requesting transcripts if you wish to apply test optional

- The Common Application can be a timesaver if you are applying to multiple schools that accept it
- Application Fees Some schools are always free, some run a free week/month, some always have a cost.
 See your counselor if you need fee waivers
- Recommendation letters ask in person, ask in advance
- Essay or personal statement

College Application Definitions

Early Action - non binding, students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1st

Early Decision - binding, students who are accepted as an ED applicant must attend that college

Rolling Admissions - applications are evaluated as they are received, rather than waiting to evaluate applications after a hard deadline

Earning College Credit

Early College:

- GVSU: Allied Health Science Program, Education Program
- Ferris: Senior Composition, AP Language, AP Literature, CARE 102, UNIV 101, Spanish

Articulation: agreements with Davenport, Baker, GRCC, CMU

AP Courses: credit awarded is decided by test score and college

CLEP: College Level Examination Program enables students to earn college credit for introductory level classes by achieving a satisfactory score on a subject specific test

Senior Year Opportunities

Senior Internship:

- Usually one trimester, one class period
- Unpaid but students earn credit

Co-op:

- Average 6 hours of work weekly for 1 hour release, 12 hours of work weekly for 2 hour release
- Co-requisite is a business course for EACH trimester of co-op
- Paid and students can earn credit

Early Graduation:

 If you have 27.5 credits and have met all of your graduation requirements by the end of 2nd trimester, you are eligible for early graduation - see counselor for details
