# A MESSAGE FROM DR. MATTHEWS

In 1992, there were one million devices connected to the internet. In 2022, the number of devices connected to the internet was 14.4 billion.

In 1990, the Human Genome Project, the ultimately first successful attempt to sequence the human genome, took 13 years from 1990 – 2003. In 2022. Star

genome, took 13 years from 1990 – 2003. In 2022, Stanford Medicine, using an ultra-rapid DNA sequencing technology, completed the process in 7 hours and 18 minutes.

It took the airlines 68 years to hit 50 million users. It took the telephone 50 years to hit 50 million users. It took television 22 years to hit 50 million users. It took computers 14 years to hit 50 million users. It took the internet 7 years to hit 50 million users. It took Pokémon Go 19 days to hit 50 million users.

In 1900, human knowledge doubled approximately every 100 years. By 1945, human knowledge was estimated to double every 25 years. Today, it is estimated that human knowledge is doubling every 13 months.

When Google was founded in 1998 it was serving 10,000 search queries a day. Now, Google estimates that it processes over 3.5 billion searches a day. The second largest search engine after Google is YouTube.

In years past, information and knowledge were often the province of a limited group of people. To access knowledge a person frequently had to have wealth or connections. Now, information, and sometimes knowledge, is available for free if you have a phone or an internet connection. M.I.T., for example, offers all of its undergraduate and graduate course materials for free online.

Why do I share all of this information with you?

How people learn is changing. How people access information is changing. How people find information is changing. How people find and use information to acquire and develop knowledge and skills is changing.

And, the Rockford Public Schools needs to keep pace.

That is why we, the Rockford Public Schools community, is engaging in a strategic planning process that will help us define the future of our school district. Our process, called RAMS – the Rockford Action Model for Success, has had 11 iterations in the last 30 years. We are currently on RAMS XI.


In November we began developing our next RAMS strategic plan – RAMS XII. We began with an online survey. In December and January, we will follow up the survey with focus groups. We will then convene a committee of students, parents, community members, and staff to analyze the information that we have gathered to identify what our community believes is our vision for the students in our district. Our vision will help craft our mission.

From there a staff committee will begin to identify goals and objectives for the next three years. If we know what our vision and mission are, where we believe and hope our students can go, then we need to identify the steps we are going to take to ensure that they get there.

In June 2024, we will present to our Board of Education the RAMS XII – our new three-year strategic plan. Over the summer we will examine the draft and in August, we will ask the Board to approve RAMS XII.

We will keep our community informed as we move along. Together, as the Rockford Public Schools community, we will continue to build a school district that prepares our students for the challenges of a changing world.

### **SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION**

#### SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS

The decision to close or delay school can be a tricky one. As a Michigan resident, you know how fickle our weather is. Just as weather systems can appear without warning, there are times when weather systems predicted to appear do not. Please keep in mind that a forecast is a prediction. Even skilled meteorologists will agree that not all watches, warnings, and advisories materialize as predicted.

School personnel carefully monitor weather forecasts and road conditions. The Rockford Public Schools district spans approximately 97 square miles. Therefore, weather and road conditions can be significantly different within our school district. Ultimately, the decision to close or delay school is made by the Superintendent of Schools, with every effort to make a decision by 5:30 am.

In summary, weather is unpredictable and district staff does their best to make reasonable and practical decisions with the safety of students as their top priority. In addition, please keep in mind that weather conditions can rapidly improve or decline from the time a decision is made in the early hours of the morning to the time school is scheduled to start. If at any time you feel it is unsafe to send your child(ren) to school due to the weather or road conditions, you are encouraged to exercise your right to keep them home with an excused absence.

#### **EARLY DISMISSALS**

Once students are in school, it is only in extreme cases the district would dismiss early due to weather, mainly due to the fact that many of our younger students could potentially go home to an empty house. However, in the rare case of an early dismissal, this will be posted on TV and the district website, and parents will be notified via the district's automated School Messenger system and/or the school phone tree.

Occasionally when road conditions deteriorate during the day, a decision is made to dismiss students up to one-half hour early to allow buses additional travel time so students arrive home at their regularly scheduled time. Morning closings and delays are posted on the district website and local TV/radio stations, with several stations offering notification options such as text or email alerts






### **Complete Your School Meal Form Today**

Michigan School Meals provide quality food that fuels good education. The new state investment allows all students to eat one breakfast and one lunch for free each day of the entire school year if they choose.

Even though all meals are free for the 2023-24 school year, there are other education benefits provided to the district, individual school building, or household that require an individual student benefit (free, reduced, paid) to be determined each year.

We're asking every family to complete and submit either the School Meal Application or Education Benefits Form (formerly the Household Information Report). The information collected is used to provide additional services and benefits beyond school meals, like resources for classrooms, teachers, and children, guidance and college counselors, and health and wellness services. Summer EBT benefits are also available for eligible households. Talk to your school about which form you need.
